In particular, we draw attention to the PalSIRP program that offers Sepkoski grants of up to \$1000 for scientists working in parts of the world in which the program's support might have particularly significant reach. These grants are made directly to individuals and not to institutions. Grantees are selected by a committee of the Paleontological Society based on the quality and feasibility of the proposed research. Grants are awarded to paleontologists at levels ranging from graduate students to professionals and to active retirees, and persons receiving them need not be members of the Society.

The geographic scope for eligible applications has been progressively expanding in recent years and includes many countries around the world, now including those in South and Southeastern Asia. Please see:
